- 52\% major city, 33\% 1-3 hours drive of a major city, $10 \%$ with a hours drive of a major city, and 5\% more than 3-hour drive.
- SSA members for $\mathbf{4 2 \%}+15$ years, 26\% don't know, 11\% 1-3 years, 11\% 4-6 years, 5\% 7-10 years, and 5\% 10-15 years.
